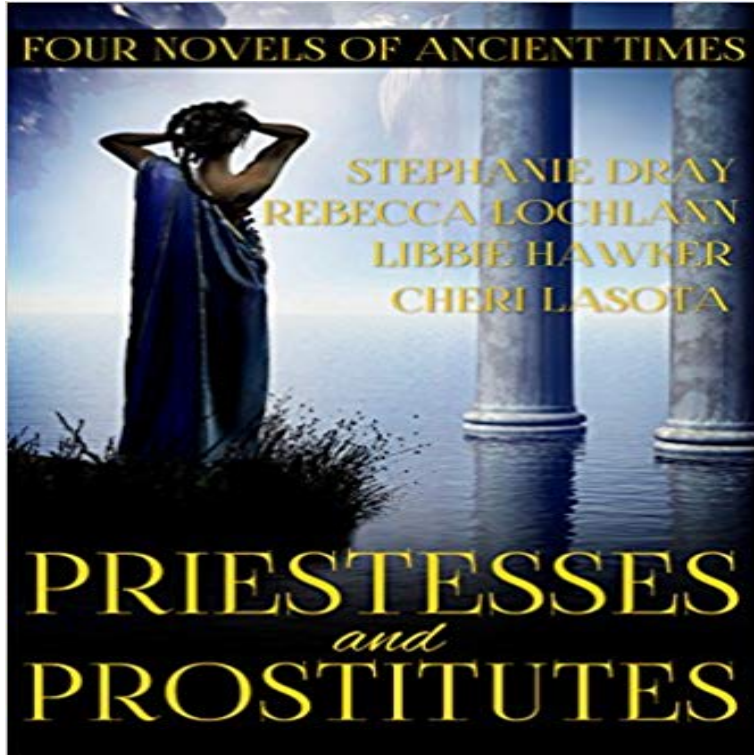


Priestesses and Prostitutes: Four Novels of Ancient Times
