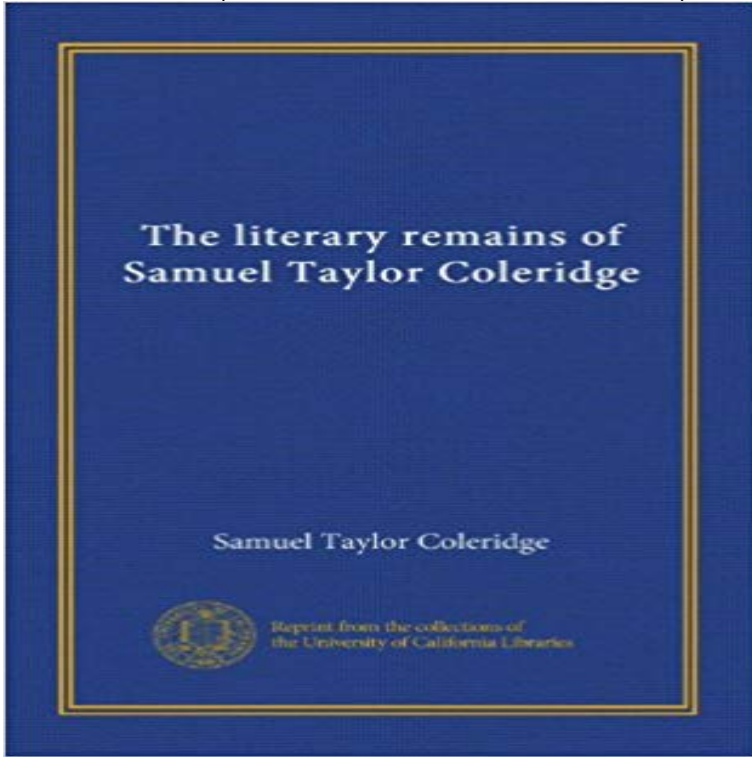


The literary remains of Samuel Taylor Coleridge (v.1)
