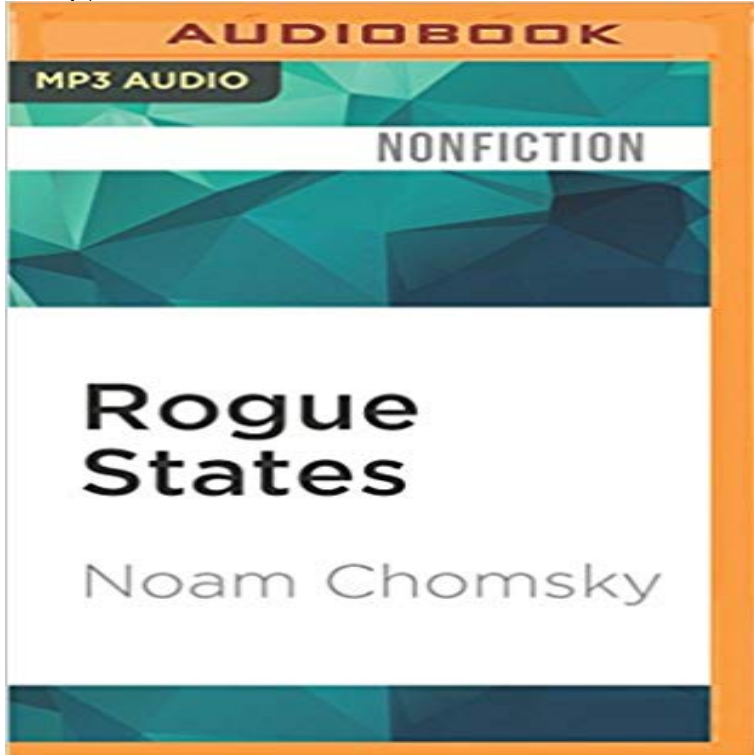


# Rogue States: The Rule of Force in World Affairs
