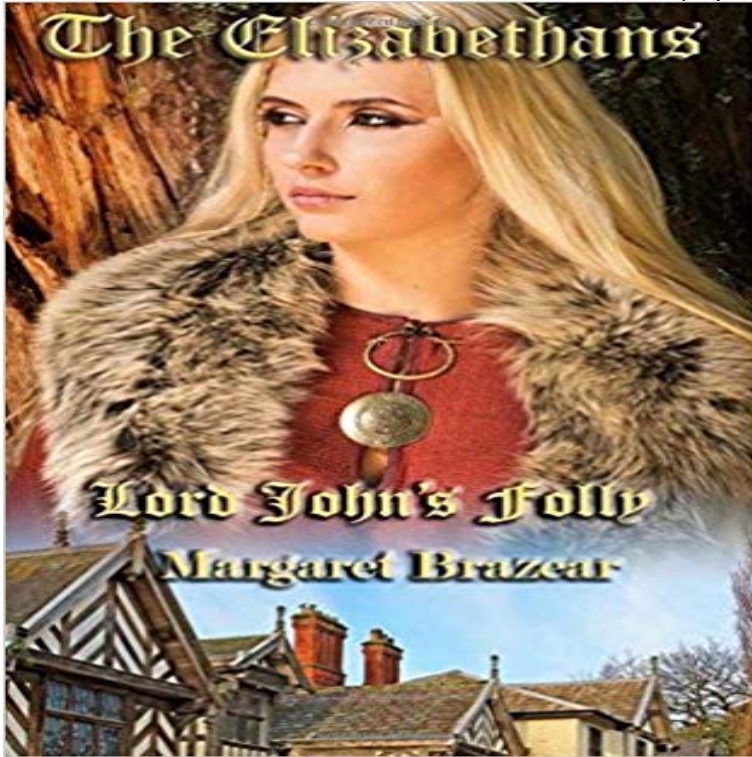


The Elizabethans: Lord Johns Folly (Volume 3)
